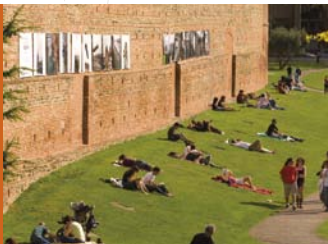


CAFÉ TERRACE

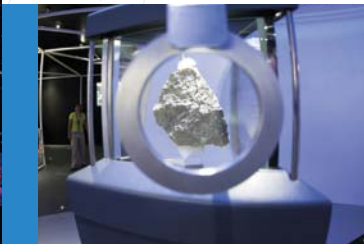


THE SOYUZ CAPSULE AT THE CITÉ DE L'ESPACE

Since the end of the 19th century, Toulouse has witnessed many daring innovations: Clément Ader and his curious “aeroplane” machine, then the Aéropostale connections with his heroes such as Antoine de Saint-Exupéry. Today, the A380 sets the standard for research and innovation. Enthusiasts can visit the Airbus production lines. A visit to Toulouse is also an opportunity to learn about the sciences of the Universe through the new activities and exhibition spaces on offer at the Cité de l'espace theme park: the Ariane V rocket, Mir space station, Imax, planetarium and more...

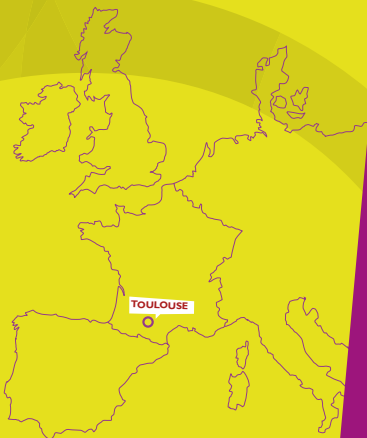
